TWO INSTRUCTOR STORIES

USING POWERPOINT AS A POWERFUL TEACHING TOOL

In 1971 I started getting involved using the computer to develop lessons to help people learn. Computers were at a primitive stage of development then but have become more and more powerful ever since. The problem is many people still don't use the available software properly. Over the years I sat through boring presentations that used PowerPoint incorrectly. Presenters would display sentences or long phrases with very few

images that were too small and then proceed to read the words to the audience.

PowerPoint has become powerful enough now that I have learned to use it to develop documentaries. What makes for a good documentary? You need to research your topic and then tell the stories by using panning and zooming techniques, short video clips, pertinent images, and minimal use of text, along with the right music and narration. Register to learn these techniques in Technology Center classes during a three-part series on January 7, 14, and 21.

I tried doing this with the documentary I have presented live on "Chicago's Only Castle," which tells the incredible stories of those responsible for taking care of that Castle, stories that are tied to Chicago's rich history. February 26, 2026, at 6:30 pm in the Sierra Ballroom, I will use PowerPoint to tell the story of, "Del Webb: Renaissance Man of the 20th Century," the person responsible for our amazing community.

HELPING MEMBERS USE APPLE iPHONE by Barbara Spagnola, LCTC Instructor

I began my volunteer work with Let's Compute Technology Club (LCTC) as a monitor in the Technology Center, which involved occasionally assisting members with technical issues. Since I enjoyed helping folks use their devices more efficiently and always received many questions about iPhones, I decided to teach beginning and intermediate iPhone classes. My career background included almost two decades with Northrop Grumman and another 18 years with Computer Sciences Corp, working in computer manufacturing systems, finance, IT contracts, and management. I found this computer experience allowed me to easily adapt to our ever-changing technology, especially that which is embedded in Apple's iPhones.

With IT manufacturers continually enhancing their hardware with new features

and the latest software updates, there are always new tips to share with our LCTC members. A smart phone is a powerful tool, which we as owners need to master and control, not the other way around! As many of us have invested significantly in our personal phones and tablets, it's to our benefit to learn to use them as easily and effectively as possible.

All the LCTC instructors and I look forward to seeing our members in future classes. Please know your questions are always welcome, and we're here to make your technology work for you!




